The session began with ringing the bell of democracy by all the dignitaries.

I am very pleased to organized 1st 'Sarpanch Sansad'. I also explained "Why should we organize such an event? The answer lies in the fact that approximately thirty-five lakh government representatives are there in India but

it is difficult for them to work together for our country, therefore we are taking a small step to work together in the form of the 'Sarpanch Sansad 2017'. India will be transformed only when rural and urban parts of our country work together. This event is organized for all the Indians to learn about the unsung, positive stories of people like you." On this occasion he also announced that 75 Sarpanchs will be getting an opportunity to interact & learn the functioning of local governance by visiting European assemblies. A prospect will also be provided to 100 Sarpanchs of from different villages to interact with Hon. Prime minister of India to discuss the hindrances in the development of villages.



Speaking on the occasion, Former Additional Divisional Commissioner, Pune, Retd. IAS **Shri. Shyam Deshpande**, said that, "Being a leader one has no right to be corrupt. Today, a 'Dalit' is a friend of a 'Brahmin', so erase all the cultural differences in your lands. I hoped to see more female Sarpanchs in our Indian villages."



Shri. Chandrakant Dalvi – IAS, Divisional Commissioner, Pune, affirmed that, "Our country is often called as the



'country of villages', but, due to the urbanization rapid pace people are migrating in a large number to the city. Unlike the past, we only see forty-five percent people living in a village". I stressed that brain drain of people should be stopped. & youngsters should part of the government.



MLA from Kothrud constituency, **Smt. Medha Kulkarni**, MLA, Kothrud, Pune, in her enthusiastic address said that, Sarpanchas must realize the importance of their position. Love your work. Understand the needs of the people. Politics is an instrument of socio-economic reforms & representation of a Sarpanch actively is crucial for a Village.



Chief guest on the occasion, **Dr. Narendra Jadhav**, Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha & Former Member, Planning Commission of India, stated that, "A village is very important for a city as: if a city is an engine then your village is the diesel, if a city is a pair of lungs then your village is the oxygen. A Sarpanch is a communicator

between the government and a common citizen. As Sarpanchs is aware of problems at the grass root level so they can be instrumental to bring change in the base of the entire village."



Dr. Joske Bunders – Director, Professor Biology and Society, HOD Dept. of Biology and Society, University of Amsterdam (VU University), keenly said that, "This is an important occasion for the democracy of India and for it to develop. We foreigners wonder that, 'How is it possible that India has so many small, organized, democratic units?' Democracy helps a country to become more prosperous. We want to focus on the villages as only the city part gets lot of attention. A panchayat is the core unit to develop the future of India. World will learn from this movement, so, please focus on the lives of the villagers by making them happy and giving them a dignified lifestyle. Most of the knowledge is with the people in the society therefore it is necessary to gather them together, collaborate with them so that their knowledge can become a very good resource for the development."



Padma Shri Award Recipient, Agricultural Scientist & a farmer, **Shri. Subhash Palekar** – I taught Sarpanchs



about the holistic spirituality and the 'Zero Budget Farming' by explaining that, "Use your own land- village's money and not any other government's money for the development of your village. Further I want to ask you that, 'how many of you have literally studied the concept of politics?' If not then study it right now. A total number of six lakh fifty thousand villages are there in India! This is a huge number. I myself have calculated that fifty-four lakh crore rupees go outside our country from our pockets. If this state continues, then how a village will be developed? One of the answers for this would be the use of the 'Zero Budget Farming'. Africa, United States of America and other Asian countries have been benefited by such a technique. Such a model requires less amount of money to be invested and thus thousands of farmers are using it successfully. Whereas, In India, we had a rainfall of 3000 ml last year, still our reservoirs were empty in the month of October. It is the responsibility of a Sarpanch to save the nature especially the water a crucial tool of farmers. Our country will develop if our city develops and our city will develop only if our village develops."

Video Message by Anna Hazareji

At the outset I would like to Congratulate Young, Dynamic & Industrious Leader Shri Rahul V. Karad & his team at MIT World Peace University.

Father of nation Late Shri Mahatma Gandhi ji always propounded that our nation cannot develop unless our villages are developed. I think this very first Sarpanch Sansad will help achieve this dream that Mahatma Gandhi ji saw and usher in a new era of upliftment of Rural India. It will help bridge the gap between India and Bharat.

Development of villages can happen only if Human values are upheld and wholesomeness of nature is ensured. And India alone can take a lead to help achieve this dream and vision. In my native village in Ralegan Siddhi there was a time when 80% people went to bed without a full meal. 40 Country liquor stores ruined the very sanctity of our village. With the hard work and efforts of my team things have undergone a sea change now. We now supply close to 200-225 trucks of vegetables and more than 6000 litres of milk daily. This is the model of development that can change the future of our rural brethren. Every drop of water that reaches the land has to be preserved for the same. A village which could not take one crop on 400 acres today cultivates 1200 acres

twice a year. Only speeches will not change our nation. Words shall have to be backed with actions.

There has to be synchronisation in words and actions. This alone will lend credibility. Only men and women with purity of character, actions, thoughts, willingness to work hard and spotless public and personal life can earn public credibility. the freedom fighters who laid down their lives for the nation have taught us just this. We will have to remember their sacrifice and dedicate our lives like a seed does to bring in a new blossom.

We will also have to develop a habit of digesting insult. we will have to resolve to never act without consulting the Gram sabha that is the peoples Court which is supreme in a village panchayat. very penny ought to be spent with the express consent of the Gram Sabha. This alone will help garner public confidence.

I'm confident that the mission taken up by Hon. Shri Rahul V. Karad in the form of this Sarpanch Sansad will go on to change the fortune of this nation.

1. Mr. Shyam Petkar - Editor, Tarun Bharat.

Warm greetings, they bestowed me with as I took the stage. A small video clip was relayed about my work and experience. I have to my credit, several Marathi movie scripts apart from being a writer, reporter and a keen social worker. As one with the faith to deliver back to the society, I have been contributing actively to the 'NAAM' foundation. My message to my companions has always been, "Human pains cannot be downloaded from Google and therefore, one must toil on ground, get surrounded by people to understand what people expect from us."



3. Mr. Shrikant Bhartiya - Officer On Special Duty, Chief Minister, Maharashtra Govt.

I stressed upon the idea of 'bottom up' development wherein, the villagers can support themselves to create 'model villages' through funds and donations instead of waiting for the Government to release funds through Ministry. As a novel thought to imbibe, I requested all my dear companions to read 'Gram Gita' authored by Saint. Tukdoji Maharaj. Unity is our strength and it is time, we display some - by collective efforts of us along with the fellow villagers.



2. Mr. Pratap Rao Dighavkar – Additional Police Commissioner, Thane.

In my remarks, I shared some of my experience that I gathered working all this while in Pune and Raigad district. I champion the cause to build houses for police constables. I believe, people in this country lack awareness and therefore, in certain cases with the gall to help the needy farmers, I took the first step in educating



4. Ms. Shweta Shalini - Guest of Honor, Speaker, BJP.

As a part of research, I shared the idea of the hub and spoke model. I believe in the Public Private Partnership Program initiated by the PM of India. I founded Village Social Transfer Foundation which has a support of 500 social workers who try to utilize various funds in the above schemes. I believe in 4 P model – Partnership between Public, Private, People and Panchayat Raj. I feel that the GPS (Gram Panchayat Self Independence) system should be adapted in every village. I have been



the founder of Gramparivartan Yojana. "It is important to change our thought process. The base of our nation is village so we should create Gram Swaraj. Learn in a cooperative way. Do not depend only on subsidy, but instead we have to light our own lamp", I stressed.



5. Mr. Pradeep Lokhande - Social Entrepreneur.

I explained my contributions which include providing libraries to almost all villages. The estimate numbers of libraries set up are 3640. I added that the world's biggest primary education begins from the villages. My motive to provide computers to villages is carried on and so far I have managed to provide 28000 computers. I believe that by 2020 the nation will be literate. After my speech a film was shown about Mylingdong, an ideal village of Meghalaya with emphasis on the role played by the Sarpanch.



6. Mr. Jayant Patil - Sarpanch, Kurdu.

I have been elected as a Sarpanch for 5th time. I was the torch bearer for supporting villagers to start a side

business of milk. The village has 25 milk dairies and has the capacity to provide 25000 litres of milk. We made new rules to reduce the stress of recovery of debts from the villages. I suggested the people to keep up with good work even in tough times. 'I want to make my Grampanchayat economically sound', my principal and words.



7. Mr. R. O Patil - Ex Sarpanch of Pachora, Jalgaon.

The job of a Sarpanch or a village head is to ask people about their concerns, worries and problems. Early redressal through legal methods is essential to develop trust among people. Villages should become self-sustainable through proper planning of Grampanchayats, Society, Co-operatives and Dairy. Positive attitude is important in creating positive environment.

SESSION III - Rural Development Plan, Execution and Finance Resources Planning



1. Shivaji Surase, Sarpanch, Takli, Pune.

It is important to win over the hearts of your opposition leaders and then, there shall be only progress because there won't be any space left for friction. I proudly share to say that without spending a single rupee, I could become a Sarpanch and so shall each one of us if we lead the path of progress. I also explained the river development in our area.

2. Gopal Patil Hijalikar, Sarpanch, Bhokar, Nanded.

I firmly believe, sarpanch does not belong to any political party and therefore, they are apolitical in their pervieew. Today, Sarpanch should become hi-tech only then they can we understand and apply appropriate Government schemes to extend timely benefits to the citizens. Government schemes are not used to facilitate citizens because of lack of curiosity and knowledge.



3. Pasha Patel - Chairman, Maharashtra State Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices & Former MLC, Maharashtra.

I discussed the problems of the farmers and the government's efforts to reduce it. I asked the Sarpanchs to collect the funds from the villagers to solve the water problems which will lead to community lakes and Bunds to increase the ground water level. I also urged the audience and the sarpanchs to form 'agricultural Produce Company' in every village that will help regulate the prices of the agricultural produce. This finally would lead to increased income of the farmers. Tree plantation would help reduce carbon levels and hence deficiency. The environmental change due to global warming

would be affecting the Agricultural sector the most. Several questions were raised in rounds and I found myself, answering them all to the best of my ability.

While answering the questions, I informed that the import duty for Gram has been increased by the Government and there are chances of getting good rates for the Gram this year. I was quick to request the Sarpanchs to unite and create a pressure group on the government that will solve majority of the problems.



4. Dr. Chandrashekar Pran, Founder, Vardan Group & Teesari Sarkar Abhiyan.

I started explaining the strength of the Gram Panchayat in democracy and also explained the clauses that empower the Gram Panchayats. I drew attention of the gathering to the fact that the British understood that some local government was necessary for efficient running of the administration hence they had introduced a 'Bombay Gram Panchayat Act – 1920. Later on, the independent government of India reformed some of its clauses and reintroduced it in the parliament.

I exclaimed that the Panchayati raj system was prevalent in Ancient India and that helped the then king to run the administration. This is a lively example which displays importance of the Local self-governments and Panchayat Raj.

The freedom of discussion, decision and action are the basics of an Independent country, it is same for India but the villages in the country still don't have that freedom and hence I believe, that the country is Independent but villages are still totally dependent on the center.





Article 40 of the Indian constitution mentions that it is the responsibility of the Government to unite the Gram Panchayats and empower them to become self-governments. According to this article, Maharashtra government has passed the bill that will give special financial and social rights to Gram Panchayat, I argued.



5. Pt. Vasant Rao Gadgil.

I delivered speech while drawing reference from the Vedic era. Togetherness is the main theme of success. I also blessed the cause of sansad and appreciated the initiatives taken by Rahul Karad.



6. Bhaskarrao Pere-Patil, Sarpanch, Patoda, Aurangabad. (Former Sarpanch)

I elaborated about the earlier days when the Sarpanch office was a shoddy room with only one chair. We initiated change in the village and one of them is to reward people who pay complete taxes. A total of 42 CCTV cameras are active in the village and the Gram Sevak monitors the situations in different places in

village in just one click. I mentioned that the Sarpanch office which had leaking roof with shattered windows was now a three storey building costing 1.5 crore rupees and it is no less than a corporate office in which there are door sensors and biometric attendance. I added a point to provide warm water for women and Children. My next major task is to reduce the pollution caused by the burning of woods in the nearby vicinity. The village has one of the best Transport systems. I believe that respecting and solving the problems of women will solve majority of the problems existing in the village. In conclusion, I narrated the cerebral gathering by explaining my concept to develop any village; people's support, contemporary thinking and the government's aid and financial support.

1. Santosh Mandlecha - President, Maharashtra Chamber of Commerce Industries and Agriculture.

I started my address by highlighting the importance of cooperation and further said that, with such parishads - sarpanchswillgetinformationaboutvarious technologies. I also assured that we will try to connect the industries associated with Maratha Chamber of commerce in the development of the villages. "Maharashtra chamber of commerce and agriculture will always help MIT to make each village a smart village dream come true", I promised. I believe that farmers are the backbone of the society as they create raw material for industries to run and again purchase it to complete the circle of business in India and added that the main aim of this sarpanch parishad is to promote programmes developed by government to all the villages and conveyed best wishes for the parishad.

2. Mr. Sitaram Rahut - Sarpanch, Sangamner.

I spoke about the merits and demerits of government schemes. I encouraged the youth for natural farming and solid waste management and shared some experience like adopting a hill and maintaining the vegetation ecosystem by watering and tree plantation. I believe, my team of people which regularly maintains the greenery of hill is the real success behind the lush green cover. "Conservation of environment is essential. Pollution is increasing in cities and at the same time villages are getting barren - this is bitter truth of today. Solid waste management and reuse of waste water is important."



3. Ms. Kalpita Patil – Sarpanch, Kalyan, Jalgaon (The Youngest Sarpanch).

I am a 3rd year engineering student working as sarpanch from last 4 years. I appealed that all the village ladies should participate in the activities which are performed in village. Equal opportunity should be given to male and female. I added that "If ladies can handle their house perfectly then they can definitely handle the big responsibilities and challenges in politics. Women have equal rights to take the decision as equal opportunity can create a smart villages. Instead of smart cities we need smart villages".



4. Shri. Himanshu Patel - Guest of Honor, Sarpanch, Phunsari, Ahmadabad, Gujrat.

At the age of 23, I started working as Sarpanch. With a population of 6000, 98% on my village community depend on farming and agriculture. "If you apply state



and centre schemes appropriately, you do not require funds or donations from NGO's or other sources. Before making smart village, make ideal/adarsh village. It is essential to maintain village culture. Instead of converting a village into city, it's essential to provide all the urban facilities in the villages." I made sure that I avail basic facilities like Toilets, drainage, water supply to each and everyone from my village. I can proudly claim that, all the people in my village have voter card, Adhar card, and bank accounts. We also own to our name, an energy plant in the village. In the village speakers are placed around. The day starts with Gandhiji's prayer and the day ends with the evening prayer. The villagers are connected through speakers.

We have started free Wi-Fi in 2010, 6 mobile towers and CCTV's in the class rooms so that parents can watch their children. Since last 5 years, we could achieve Zero dropout rate in school. This entire set up was established in last 10 years. I ended with good wishesh for Sarpach Sansad and appealed for organising such events in Gujarat too.



5. Shri. Sharad Butte Patil.

I spoke about the development of village and added, that it's important to find out the strengths of the villages to implement the schemes. For this, survey is important in which technology plays a very important role. Various programs are being implemented by government for anganwadi, primary schools, animal health and vaccination, agriculture; but unfortunately due to lack of communication it's not reaching to the people. I

spoke about the lack of awareness of the Government schemes. It is important to know the technology. "Schemes will not come to you; you need to go to the schemes. There are many schemes but there is lack of awareness amongst the Sarpanch. Technology is advancing but Sarpanch are not using it. Even you download the app; you will get all the information about the GRs and various schemes in just one click. Whatever rights are given to you use it to its fullest", I urged.



6. Shri. Budajirao Mulik - Founder and President, Bhumata Charitable Trust.

I spoke about the management of schemes and at the same time, stressed upon the fact that law and order should be followed in the village. Unity should be maintained in the village. "Now it's era of remote sensing, GIS, GPS, Pressure farming – implying we should learn technology to make farmers wealthy. Agriculture department must plan regular visits to solve the problems and distress."

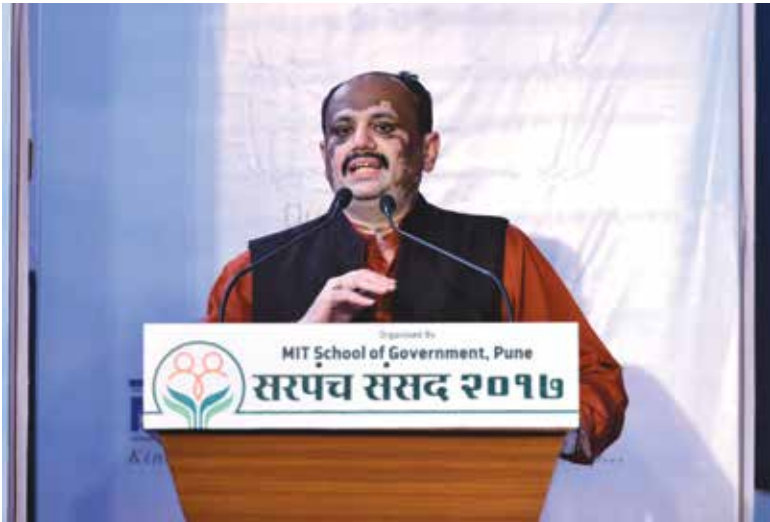

1.Shri. Yogesh Bhidvai - Deputy Editor, Lokmat Newspaper, Mumbai.

I started with the opportunities that can be given to villagers. Government has started 'Smart City project. People from villages are coming to cities and facing many problems so quite difficult to make smart city. Instead now we can concentrate on making our village smart. I explained the importance of using new technology in the villages. Awareness of technology should be carried out in the village so that villagers can make use of it.



2. Dr. Sumant Pande - Chairman, Center of Water Literacy, Yashada Foundation.

I started with a video of Bhogan gata and spoke about the source of water cycle and expressed encouragement in water

harvesting program. According to me, "Water literacy is very important to save the water" and stressed upon effective utilization of the funds made available by the government.

3. Shri. Ranjeet Sing Kamtekar, Sarpanch, Dist. Nanded.

I spoke about the self-learning and earning. I expressed that the quality education should be given in the school so villages should not do discrimination. We promoted non addiction in his village.

4. Shri. Bhau Saheb - Sarpanch, Shisane, Nashik.

I started anganwadi in my village and facilitated with several toilets in public spaces & highlighted importance of cleanliness in the villages. At the Zila Parishad level, my school is ranked often with the 1st rank. I explained the importance of follow up of the activities till you get success & added vividly, "not to depend on any gram sevak. Work yourself to make your village a model village. Get knowledge of CSR and utilize it".



5. Dr. Prakrit Podar - Managing Trustee, Podar Fondation and Expert Mental Therapist.

I expressed that Sarpanch is the energy of the village and added that proper use of technology can create a smart village but alone technology cannot bring development. I also spoke about the yoga which is helpful for the day to day life of villagers as yoga can reduce the stress levels.



said “Percolate water greedily; use it wisely as it is our duty to make it available for coming generations”.



7. Shri. Madhav Bhandari - Chief Spokesperson, BJP, Water Conservation Expert.

Although water conservation is necessary, there are several steps to be followed & described the importance of Gram sabha and how can we make use of it for the development of the village. I also stated that dam water should be used for domestic purposes and when we have increased level of ground water, it should be released for agriculture purpose. I suggested Prof. Rahul Karad to select 100 sarpanch for Prime minister’s visit to discuss their problems & also requested organising foreign visit to study their policies and functions in the area of water, agriculture etc.

Voting on Resolution

We the participants of 2nd Sarpanch Sansad, appeal to government for equal distribution of water between states and pledge for conservation of Water at personal and social life as well as to convince others for save Water.



6. Shri. Suresh Khanapurkar - Water Conservation Expert.

I started my talk saying, “80% of land depends on rain. There is no provision of water management and hence as a result, inadequate water supply leads to farmers committing suicide. Therefore, we need to stop water in order to save water” I also spoke about improving ground water level which will increase density of water. I added that “Building the bunds near the farms to save water can be one of the solutions”. Proper drainage should be maintained. In the rainy session, rainwater harvesting should be adopted. We promoted Shirpur pattern to harvest water. They have saved drinkable water for coming 3 years by Jalsandharan. For me, “Amount of rainfall is not important, percolation of water in the ground is more important. Method of percolation can be any one but output should be visible”. I studied layers of soils and geology for last 60 years. I suggested for building bunds in minimum investment & invited everyone to visit Shirpur to understand the pattern. I

For last 15 years, villagers have not filed even a single case in the police station. I further said that it is very important to walk on the path given by great saints to achieve the goal.

Mrs. Bhagyeshri Narawade - Woman Sarpanch, Ambe Dhumal, Sangamner, Ahmadnagar.

I thanked Shri. Rahul Karad for organizing this Sansad and giving women the opportunities to express their thoughts. I have ambition of making a village as replica of Ralegan Siddhi. I was elected without opposition in my village in spite of having domestication for last 40 years & gave chance to all the five female members to work as a sarpanch. We planted and preserved 1200 trees. I added about the Liquor free village story & mentioned that this sansad gave a platform to discuss their difficulties with everyone.





Shri. Shekhar Gaikwad - Chairman, Ground Water Survey and Development Agency, IAS.

"I have completed thirty years in administrative services and whatever I have experienced in my working I would like to share the same with you all."

While talking about Village heads and Sarpanch, I observed that there are no formal trainings for Sarpanch. There should be training given for Sarpanch especially female Sarpanch so that they serve their term efficiently." Sharing experiences from Nashik, I said, "As per the rule, membership of the Sarpanch having three or more pupils should be revoked & observed that a little over 150 cases were filed regarding the same." I further added, "That such problems still prevail in many Gram Panchayats and one should take responsibility to train Sarpanch and Gram Sevaks with regards to such problems."

"Small things can make many changes in villages like Cleanliness, improved and developed Cremation grounds among others. The face of villages should be without bringing politics in between," I added.

While in Thane as C.E.O, I discussed how we changed the economics of many villages by transferring the funds from current to saving accounts and how one can plan the salaries of many Gram Sevaks through small financial planning.

I also suggested Gram Sevaks and Sarpanchs that one should think about village finance as their personal finance and improve the economics. Such Sarpanch

Sansad should also discuss the intricacies about the financial development of villages by concentrating on small aspects. Right from developing road signs to concretization of roads all these things should be given a thought while working as Sarpanch."

I also suggested that, Villages should be branded and the best villages should be accredited.

"Gram Panchayat should also concentrate to increase their income by small ideation like developing ATMs of various bank and renting the office space to the banks. Such small things will surely change the face of Gram Panchayat,"

"Digitalization of schools and pre-primary schools is also possible if Sarpanchs request the village youngsters and officials working in the cities to help the village in the field of education," I suggested.



Shri. Satish Kumar, Swadeshi Jagran Manch.

I appreciated all the representatives who are part of nation development for

participating in the sansad enthusiastically. I talked about revolution system in Punjab agriculture. I said that 14% is the current rate of agriculture GDP. The very important thing in front of us is to increase income of farmers. I appealed all to suggest the ideas that can be incorporated in the policies to increase income of the farmers. If it increases GDP will increase greatly and it will have great impact on national development.

"I regret that I am here on Valedictory function, as I should have attended this three-day Sansad. I believe that listening to the speeches is how I developed my knowledge about Maharashtra and therefore, I hold - such Sansads can bring change in the thought process of Sarpanchs. There are many villages with zero per cent crime rate. It is important to save villages and Sarpanchs who are sitting in front of me as they are the backbones to save the village culture in Maharashtra. There are many

beautiful things in villages like Kirtan and Bhajans which are worth appreciating and such Sansad will certainly help villages to share their experiences,".



Shri. Popatrao Pawar - Guest of Honor, Sarpanch, Hivare Bazar & Executive Director, Maharashtra State Government's Model Village Programme.

I started with "A Sarpanch is known by his/her Panchayat. So, Panchayat should be considered as a 'Mandir'. One should be industrious and honest towards this profession." As a Sarpanch, I was offered several political opportunities but I always reminded myself that my real job is to serve my village and nothing beyond that. All of you should adopt the pivotal concept of developing the village by reading an epic called 'Gramgeeta'. Everyone should take inspiration from the great Ahilyabai Holkar who in the old, difficult Indian days fearlessly won the hearts of her villagers. In every school 'haripath' should be made compulsory, and all schools should have a play ground. Finally, we must attone to the path shown by our saints"

Shri. Subhash Palekar - Padma Shri Award Recipient, Agricultural Scientist, Farmer.

I requested all the Sarpanch to remain committed to the cause of the nation. Government is providing a lot of schemes. Each village is provisioned with few lacs of rupees. Despite adequate roads, clean water supply, and expansion of education – our younger generations are moving towards cities. They are ready to work as a peons. A girl is yet not equipped in farm labour. We are

running behind the development but development is not only about school, roads but first emphasis should be given to farmers' development. Money being held in cities must be rolled into villages. Village development will lead to nation's development. There are different types of farming techniques, but we must stick to swadeshi techniques to maintain Indianness. Same with cows. One must prefer Deshi cows over Jersey cows. I stressed on giving education in Marathi. Several research have shown that the developed states have more percentage of suicide. We don't want development that will compel farmers to suicide. We should preserve our values and adopt Zero Budget farming.



Dr. Vishwanath Karad - President, MIT WPU and UNESCO Chair Holder.

I believe that Dr. Vasantdada Patil was a visionary and shared my experiences with Dr. Vasantdada Patil talking about him giving us, the MAEER's group - permission to start a private institute. I humbly expressed my gratitude towards DR. Vijay Bhatkar and also added that in Dyaneshwari not a single word is based on caste and religion. I stressed the words of Swami Vivekanand that 'Union of science and spirituality alone will bring the harmony to the mankind.' Here at MIT, we strive to have a blend of science and spirituality. I connected the dots by sharing an example of Albert Einstein, the veteran scientist and connected it to the words of Dyaneshwara. This sansad has created networking of mind. 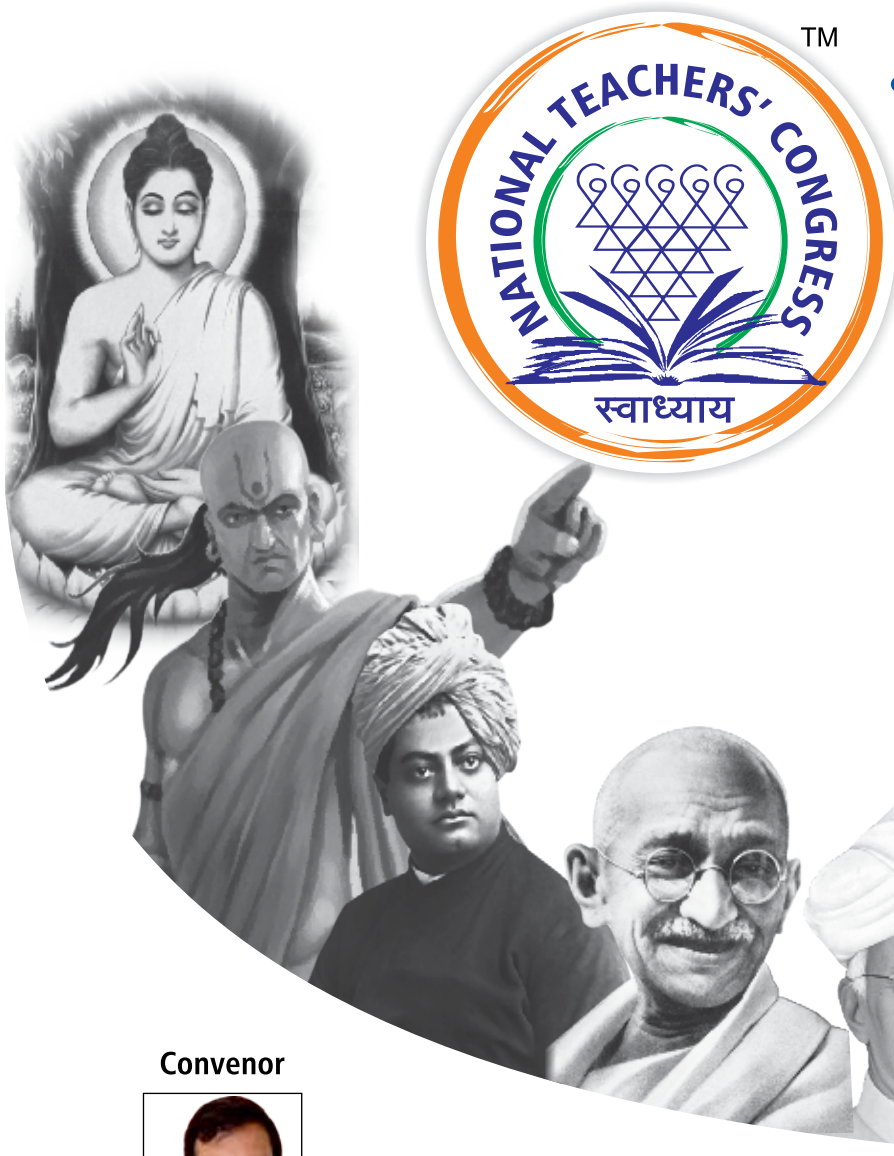

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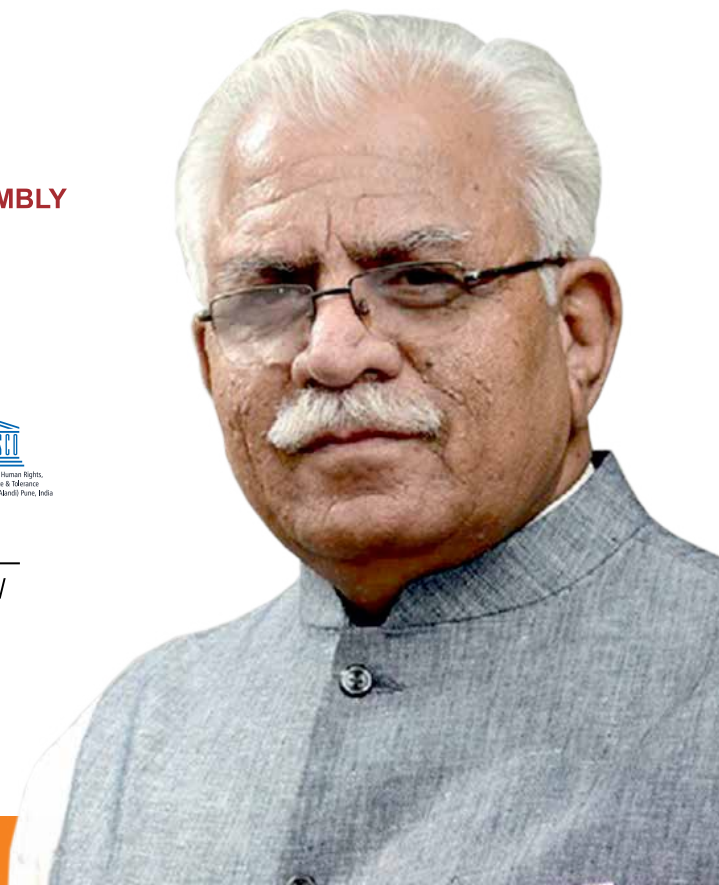
